### THE SKINNY

Coming off its fifth-straight bowl appearance, the Nevada football team begins the 2010 season on Thursday night against FCS foe Eastern Washington at Mackay Stadium ... The Wolf Pack and Eagles will be meeting for the ninth time in history with all of the previous games coming when both were members of the Big Sky Conference ... The Wolf Pack owns a 7-1 advantage in the all-time series ... Nevada won the last meeting between the schools, 51-14 in Cheney, Wash. ... Interestingly enough, the starting quarterback for the Eagles in that 1991 game was Beau Baldwin, Eastern Washington's third-year head coach ... Thursday marks the debut of Nevada defensive coordinator Andy Buh, a former standout linebacker at Nevada ... Nevada is unranked in both polls but did receive votes in the USA Today Coaches Top 25 ... The Wolf Pack returns 15 starters from last year's team that went 8-5 overall and 7-1 (second place) in Western Athletic Conference play ... Included among the returners are six All-WAC players, including a pair of 1,000-yard rushers in senior quarterback Colin Kaepernick and senior running back Vai Taua, as well as the reigning WAC Defensive Player of the Year, senior defensive end Dontay Moch ... Overall, Nevada returns nine starters on offense as the Wolf Pack led the nation in rushing in 2009.

### HOME SWEET HOME

Firs the first time since 1991, Nevada will open the season with three consecutive home games at Mackay Stadium and, in all, the Wolf Pack play at Mackay seven times this season. Nevada opens the year with Thursday's game against Eastern

## MEDIA SERVICES

### Practice Schedule/Interview Policy

Nevada student-athletes and coaches are available for interviews Monday and Tuesday before practice. Coaches are also available before practice Wednesday and Thursday but those practices are closed to the media and public. (Schedule adjusted if game is on Thursday or Friday). All interview arrangements must be made through the Nevada Media Services office. Nevada generally practices at 2:15 p.m. each day (interviews at 1:45 p.m.), but please check with the media services office for any changes to the weekly schedule. Players are not allowed to do telephone interviews unless it is with their hometown media or a national media outlet and pre-arranged through the Nevada Media Services office.

### Postgame Interviews

Postgame interviews will be conducted in the media room on the first floor of Cashell Football Center. No Nevada student-athletes or coaches are to be interviewed on the field or en route to the locker room, and the Nevada locker room is closed. Following the NCAA's 10-minute cooling off period, Nevada head coach Chris Ault and three to four requested players will be available.

For road games, Nevada's locker room will be closed, but Ault and requested players will be available outside the visiting locker room or in the designated visiting media interview area after the NCAA's 10-minute cooling off period. No student-athletes are to be interviewed on the field or en route to the locker room.

### Media Work Area

The Paul R. Stuart Press Box in Mackay Stadium has wireless, Ethernet and phone lines available during the game and up to one and half hours after the conclusion of each game. The interview/media work room in Cashell Football Center has Ethernet and phone lines available. Media are asked to work in the Cashell media room if working more than 90 minutes post-game. The press box at Mackay Stadium will close 90 minutes following the game.

### Weekly Quarterback Club Luncheons

Beginning Sept. 13 and continuing each Monday throughout the season, the AAUN hosts a Quarterback Club Luncheon at the Peppermill Hotel/Casino at 11:30 a.m. Head coach Chris Ault and selected student-athletes will speak to the attendees and are available for additional interviews after lunch. The luncheon is open to the public and lunch costs \$17. For more info, call 682-6965. The Oct. 4 luncheon will be held in Carson City.

### WAC Coaches Teleconference

From Aug. 24 through Nov. 23, the WAC head football coaches will take part in a conference call every Monday, starting at 9:30 a.m. (Pacific). Each coach is allotted seven minutes with Chris Ault slated for 10:14 a.m. PT. Media wishing to participate should call the Nevada Media Services Office or the WAC for the call-in information. A replay of the call is available.

### Credentials

All requests for credentials & parking passes for Wolf Pack football games should be made through the Nevada Media Services Office no later than 48 hours before game time.

Please fax credential requests on company letterhead to (775) 784-4386. Media can reach the Mackay Stadium press box (second level on the west side of the stadium) by using the elevator or the stairways on the north and south ends of the building.

### Parking

There are two areas of media parking and each is parking-pass specific. The "Blue" media parking is located behind Lombardi Recreation Building, southeast of the stadium. The lot may be accessed by taking Evans Avenue and then turning west on East Stadium. Lot is on your left. The other media parking is in the West Stadium Parking Complex, located directly west of Mackay Stadium. General parking is also available on floors 4, 5 and 6 and can only be accessed from Virginia Street via Sixteenth Street.

Local television satellite trucks have designated parking near the main (southwest) entrance to the stadium. These trucks must be in place at least two hours before game time and cannot leave while crowds are present outside the stadium.

Washington. Next week, Colorado State comes to Mackay. One of the most anticipated games of the year will be Sept. 17 against Cal, as the Bears will be making their first trip to Reno ever in the 24-game history between the schools.

Western Athletic Conference home games this year include Utah State on Oct. 6, which will be the Homecoming game. On Oct. 30, San Jose State comes to town for the Hall of Fame Game. New Mexico State will visit Mackay Stadium on Nov. 20 before the showdown against WAC rival Boise State on Friday, Nov. 26.

### TEAM CAPTAINS

Four Wolf Pack standouts were selected by their teammates to serve as captains for the 2010 season, head coach Chris Ault announced at the close of fall camp.

On the offensive side of the ball, senior quarterback Colin Kaepernick and senior tight end Virgil Green were selected as captains. From the defense, senior defensive end Ryan Coulson and junior linebacker James-Michael Johnson were the selections. Voting was done by the players.

"I believe all four were excellent choices and I think the team did a nice job selecting this group of captains," head coach Chris Ault said.

This is the first year as a captain for all four players.

### 2010 SEASON OUTLOOK

The 2010 Nevada football season arrives with great excitement about the potential of this Wolf Pack team. With 15 starters back, including nine on the best rushing offense a year ago, and the addition of a couple of veteran and talented coaches on the defensive side of the ball, Nevada has unlimited potential for the 2010 season.

The campaign won't come without some challenges, however. Nevada will play a tough 13-game schedule with games against Cal and BYU highlighting the non-conference schedule and a difficult WAC slate with road games against Fresno State, Hawaii and Louisiana Tech and a visit from defending WAC champions Boise State at Mackay Stadium.

The following is a position-by-position preview of the 2010 Wolf Pack:

#### Quarterbacks

Leading the charge is senior Colin Kaepernick, one of the top quarterbacks in the country. Kaepernick's rushing exploits – back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons on the ground – have overshadowed his ability to throw the ball as he has more than 7,000 passing yards in his career. Kaepernick and the Pack will open the passing game this season but as perhaps the best dual-threat quarterback in the nation, Kaepernick will have plenty of weapons available in his arsenal. And the depth is in great shape with junior Tyler Lantrip and redshirt freshman Mason Magleby vying for the backup job.

Kaepernick has always possessed a strong arm and the senior has worked tirelessly in the off-season to refine his delivery. Kaepernick's completion percentage has improved from 53.8 as a freshman in 2007 to 58.9 last year as a junior. But it's the passing efficiency that head coach Chris Ault will be looking at. Kaepernick's career efficiency number is 139.3. Perhaps the most impressive passing statistic for Kaepernick is his touchdown-to-interception ratio of 61 to 16 for his career.

Lantrip is a ready and capable backup in his fourth year in the program. He has seen action in 10 games in his career, completing 4-of-10 for 37 yards and rushing for 44 yards and another

### Running Backs

One of the most lethal backfields in the country returns its top rusher in senior Vai Taua, a Doak Walker Award Candidate who is coming off back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing season. Taua, a two-time first-team All-WAC selection, holds two of Nevada's top eight single-season rushing performances with 1,521 yards in 2008 (4th) and 1,345 in 2009 (8th). He needs just 22 yards to become the sixth back in Nevada history to rush for 3,000 yards in a career. But he'll be pushed by a talented stable of young backs, led by sophomore Mike Ball and junior Lampford Mark, both of whom earned valuable playing time last year. Redshirt freshman Stephon Jefferson is also looking to contribute, as is sophomore transfer Nick Hale.

The unsung member of the group is Courtney Randall, a senior who quietly fills the duties of being a short-yardage specialist and one of the best blockers in the backfield. Randall, who has already graduated and will work on graduate studies this fall, will look to get more touches in his final year and cap off a strong career at Nevada.

### Wide Receivers

The good news for Nevada is that all three starters return from last year in senior Chris Wellington, junior Tray Session and sophomore Brandon Wimberly – last year's WAC Freshman of the Year. The better news is the fact that the Pack has some younger receivers ready to compete and a couple of newcomers looking to make an immediate impact. The planned result is that increased competition will make the unit and each player better.

Wellington played through injuries throughout the 2009 season and saw his production dip from 632 yards and 6 TDs as a sophomore in 2008 to 327 yards and one score last year. But he enters his senior year healthy and eager to become a leader on the field. Wimberly is now a known commodity after catching 53 balls for 733 yards and six scores last years, the team's leader in each category. Session will be looking to have a breakout season after showing glimpses of that a year ago. Seniors Moe Patterson and Malcolm Shepherd are looking to contribute more in their final seasons and the Pack also welcomes back junior Shane Anderson and sophomore L.J. Washington. Juco transfer Rishard Matthews, also a talented return man, will push for a starting job and Aaron Bradley could figure in the mix as a true freshman.

### Tight Ends

First-year coach James Spady inherits one of the most athletic tight

ends in school history in Virgil Green, a candidate for the John Mackey Award, given annually to the nation's best tight end. Green was a second-team All-WAC selection a year ago and is the front-runner to earn first-team honors this year as a senior. He has caught 37 passes in his career for 424 yards and six touchdowns. But at 6-foot-5 and just 245 pounds, he is also one of the op blockers in the league. Green was named the Nevada Strength and Conditioning Athlete of the Year (all sports) last year.

Behind Green is unproven depth and a goal going into fall camp was to develop that depth after the loss of Talaiasi Puloka Jr. and Kevin Bohr to graduation a year ago. Junior Zach Sudfeld has battled some injuries earlier in his career but is ready to make an impact. Nevada also shifted redshirt freshman Stephen Jeffers from guard to tight end in the offseason.

### Offensive Line

Run-game coordinator and offensive line coach Cameron Norcross enters the 2010 season with two proven commodities locking down the guard positions. Senior John Bender, who was drafted in Canadian Football League draft this spring, is back for his senior season and sophomore Chris Barker also returns after starting all 13 games a year ago as a redshirt freshman. But the task for Norcross is to solidify the two tackle spots and pick from a talented group at the center position.

Steve Haley is back for his junior season after starting eight games at one tackle spot last year. But he will be pushed by sophomore Jeff Nady, who could also find a starting job at the other tackle spot, which was expected to be locked down by senior Jose Acuna. The two starters will come out of that threesome but redshirt freshman Joel Bitonio might also be ready to make an impact.

At center, there is a trio of juniors battling for the starting job. Jeff Meads has the most time in the Union but converted defensive lineman Scott Frisbie will push hard for the job, as will highly decorated juco transfer Jordan Mudge.

### Defensive Line

The conversation clearly begins with the return of senior end Dontay Moch, who is on the verge of becoming the most prolific pass rusher in Nevada history. Moch, who already holds Nevada's single-season records for sacks (11.5 in 2008) and tackles for loss (20.0 in 2009), has a chance to set both Nevada's and the WAC's career marks in each category this season. On the other end of the line, senior Ryan Coulson is

poised for a big year. Coulson had a strong fall camp and could wreak havoc opposite Moch, especially if the latter sees double- and triple-teams this season. Inside, the focus throughout fall camp was on creating depth. Junior Zack Madonick, a 13-game starter a year ago, returns and could emerge as one of the better tackles in the league. The projected starter at the other tackle spot is junior Brett Roy, a linebacker-turned-defensive end-turned-defensive tackle. Roy, now 6-foot-4, 280 pounds could be spelled by juco transfer Willie Faataualofa. Further depth at the position includes sophomore Mark Avery and redshirt freshman Jack Reynoso.

### Linebackers

The big move of the offseason in the linebacking corps was shifting James-Michael Johnson from the outside to the middle linebacker spot. Johnson has handled the move well but he's been pushed every step of the way by sophomore Albert Rosette, who had a strong spring and was the star of fall camp, according to coach Chris Ault.

At the strong-side spot, Brandon Marshall is back for his junior season. Marshall has shown glimpses of strong play in his first two seasons and is looking for the consistency that can produce a breakout year. He's been pushed hard by both Adam Liranzo and Kaelin Burnett.

On the weak-side, the battle between senior Kevin Grimes and juco transfer DeAndre Boughton will likely go up to the season opener and beyond. Boughton had a strong spring after transferring from Fresno City College but the workhorse Grimes has had a strong camp and is in year two as a linebacker after converting from safety last year.

### Secondary

Junior Isaiah Frey returns to his starting cornerback position and he's poised for a breakout season. Frey has quietly developed into a dependable corner and the Nevada coaches believe he has All-WAC potential. Sophomore Khalid Wooten could also see time behind Frey. On the other side, senior Doyle Miller and sophomore Thaddeus Brown have been battling for the starting job. Miller played well down the stretch in 2009 and had a strong spring while Brown had a strong fall camp.

There is inexperience in the middle of the secondary however as there is only one career college start combined between all of the safeties on Nevada's roster. Corbin Louks, a former quarterback who transferred from Utah, should enter the year as the starter at free safety but juco transfer Bubba Boudreaux will also see time. At the strong safety position, sophomores Duke Williams and Marlon Johnson as well as juco transfer Dean Faddis are all in the mix.

### Special Teams

Nevada should get a boost in the return game by the addition of juco standout Rishard Matthews, who led all jucos last year in punt returning. Matthews could also see time as a kick returner, along with sophomore Mike Ball and senior Chris Wellington. Also in the mix as a return man, especially on punts, is sophomore Khalid Wooten.

The kicking game returns senior punter Brad Langley and kicker Ricky Drake. Langley has a strong leg and could emerge as one of the best in the WAC this year. Drake, who will miss the first two games, is also being pushed by junior Nick Rhodes and redshirt freshman Anthony Martinez.

### TOP RUSHING ATTACK

Nevada's exploits on the ground last season were simply astonishing. The most notable achievement was monumental as the Wolf Pack became the first team in the history of college football to have three 1,000-yard rushers. A slew of other national, conference and school marks were set, tied or otherwise reached.

This year, Nevada returns two of those 1,000-yard rushers in senior quarterback Colin Kaepernick

#### LOOKING FOR A RETURN

Looking for the last time a Nevada player returned a punt or a kickoff for a touchdown? You have to go back a little bit in the history books.

The last time Nevada returned a punt for a touchdown, coach Chris Ault was the school's athletic director and a portion of this year's roster was still in elementary school. It was Marlon McLaughlin who accomplished the feat, a 73-yard return for a score against Louisiana Tech on Oct. 13, 2001. That's a stretch of 106 straight games. It's been even longer (137 straight games) since Nevada had a kickoff return for a touchdown – all the way back to Oct. 31, 1998, when Del Bates took one back 89 yards against Boise State.

#### WATCH LIST HONORS

The 2010 Nevada football season begins with a record number of Watch List honors for a slew of Wolf Pack players.

Senior quarterback Colin Kaepernick led the way by being named to six Watch Lists for end-of-the-year college football awards. The Turlock, Calif., native was named to Watch Lists for the Walter Camp Player of the Year Award, the Maxwell Award (player of the year), Manning Award (top quarterback), Davey O'Brien Award (top quarterback), Johnny

Unitas Award (top senior quarterback) and the inaugural Hornung Award (most versatile player). Kaepernick is an All-American candidate who has also been mentioned as a Heisman Trophy candidate.

Senior defensive end Dontay Moch is on four different Watch Lists. The Chandler, Ariz., native was named to the Watch Lists for the Bronko Nagurski Trophy (outstanding defensive player), Chuck Bednarik Award (defensive player of the year); Hendricks Award (top defensive end) and the Lott Trophy (impact defensive player). He is also an All-American Candidate. Moch was also named the WAC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year.

Senior running back Vai Taa has been named to the Watch List for the Doak Walker Award (top running back) for the second year in a row. The Lompoc, Calif., native is also an All-American candidate.

Senior tight end Virgil Green is on the Watch List for the John Mackey Award, given annually to the nation's top tight end.

Sophomore receiver Brandon Wimberly has been named to the Watch List for the Biletnikoff Award (top receiver in the nation) after winning WAC Freshman of the Year honors last year.
